At the Fund for the Arts, we believe in the transformative power of the arts. By investing in strategic initiatives that drive impact in the areas of health, education, economic development, and quality of place, Fund for the Arts is working to make Greater Louisville an even better place to live, work, and visit.

The William Tolbert Whittenberg Scholarship for Performing Arts Excellence awards young people the financial means to pursue advanced study in the performing arts. Annually, the scholarship awards up to \$5,000 to performers between the ages of 16 to 20 for expenses such as tuition, apprenticeship with a coach or company, seminars, workshops, summer programs or advanced study.

Applicant Eligibility

Applicants meeting the criteria below are eligible to apply for the Whittenberg scholarship program:

- Young performing artists of the Greater Louisville region
- Between the ages of 16 and 20
- Who plans to pursue a professional career in the performing arts

Greater Louisville is defined as Jefferson, Bullitt, Shelby, Spencer, and Oldham Counties in Kentucky and Clark and Floyd Counties in Indiana.

Award Amount & Eligible Expenses

Scholarships up to \$5,000

Scholarship funds are to be used solely for advanced professional training in the performing arts and may be used towards such expenses as tuition, apprenticeship with a coach or company, seminars, workshops, or advanced study.

The scholarship may NOT be used for the purchase of instruments or equipment. Funds will not be awarded if such award will reduce or replace other financial support available to the applicant.

Program Timeline

Applications must be received by the deadline. Late entries cannot be accepted.

- February 21, 2017: Applications are available on the Fund for the Arts website www.FundForTheArts.org/arts-impact/the-whittenberg-scholarship
- April 7, 2017: Complete applications are due by 11:59pm EST
- Early-April: Select applicants invited to audition via email
- Mid-April to Early-May, 2017: Auditions held in Louisville Kentucky
- Late-May to Early-June, 2017: Award decisions will be announced via email
