A student involved in the arts is four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement, and low-income students who are highly engaged in the arts are twice as likely to graduate from college as their peers with no arts education. Additionally, student participation in the arts leads to the development of 21st Century skills, such as creativity, collaboration, communication, and critical thinking. These skills are imperative for the development of students who are college and career ready.
