Please Note:

- In the past, a Senior Pass or Senior Pass app was needed for admission — **NO PASS or APP is needed for 2026 programming.**
- No pre-registration or ticketing of any kind is required unless specified by the partner.
 - Partners may require identifying or contact information for reporting processes as part of check-in, including but not limited to ID, email address, and zip code
- Event admission fee coverage is for Seniors 65+ ONLY, unless otherwise specified by the partner.

Ambo Dance Theatre - Dance Performance and Workshop

- **WHAT:** Join Ambo Dance Theatre for an evening of modern and contemporary dance! See a variety of performances and step on the stage with professional dancers to learn modern dance technique and how to create your own choreography!
- **WHEN:** June 19 from (7 – 8 pm) -- *formerly June 12*

- **NOTE:** Ambo Dance Theatre is on the second floor of the building accessible only by stairs. Parking and entrance are on the NE side of the building (near the intersection of Clarks Ln and Fleet Ave)

Ambo Dance Theatre - Dance Performance in Central Park

- **WHAT:** Join Ambo Dance Theatre for a modern and contemporary dance performance in Central Park showcasing original works from the 2026 Kentucky Dance Festival, Well Behaved Womxn, and more!
- **WHEN:** May 31 and June 7 (7 – 8 pm)

- NOTE: This event is part of Kentucky Shakespeare Pre-shows.

Bernheim Forest and Arboretum

- WHAT: Let your imagination run wild, explore nature with a hike on one of our numerous trails, visit the Forest Giants and our 28ft. tall Tin Man! Enjoy fresh food and drink at Issac's Cafe.
- WHEN: June 1 (8 am – 8 pm)

Charlestown State Park – Guided Rose Island Tour

- WHAT: Enjoy a 2-hour guided tour of Rose Island, a former Summer Resort. The Rose Island trail is 1-mile. You must take the steep hill on Trail 3 to the Rose Island Trail, hill is .70-mile and very steep. Transportation down and back up the hill is provided on all guided tours.
- WHEN: (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every Friday (2 pm), Saturday & Sunday (10 am)
 - *Formerly Every Sunday, Friday, Saturday (9 am – 5 pm)*
- WHERE: 12500 State Road 62, Charlestown IN 47111
- NOTE: Please wear appropriate footwear for light to moderate hiking and bring plenty of fluids to keep hydrated.

Charlestown State Park – On Your Own Picnic or Hike AND Charlestown State Park Trail Challenge

- WHAT:
 - On Your Own Picnic or Hike: Take a hike on one of the 7 trails or have a picnic at one of the shelters or picnic areas located throughout the park.
 - Charlestown State Park Trail Challenge: Up for a hiking challenge? Grab a Trail challenge brochure and hike all of the trails in Charlestown State Park and earn a Challenge Pin! Brochures can be found online, at the Charlestown Main Gate, and the Charlestown Camp gate.
- WHEN: (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every day (7 am – 9 pm)
- WHERE: 12500 State Road 62, Charlestown IN 47111
- NOTE: Your admission is free. When the challenge is completed, the pin is 'purchased' at the main gate or park office for a suggested donation of \$5 or more.

Conrad-Caldwell House Museum – Self-Guided Tour

- **WHAT:** Enjoy a self-guided tour of one of Louisville’s most iconic historic homes. Explore our 10,000-square-foot Richardsonian Romanesque mansion at your own pace, taking in the craftsmanship, architecture, and stories that define the Gilded Age. Learn about the lives of the Caldwell family, their children, and the domestic staff who maintained the household, as well as gain insight into what Louisville was like in the early 1900s.
- **WHEN:** (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every Wednesday – Sunday (12 – 2:30 pm)
- **WHERE:** 1402 Saint James Court, Louisville KY 40208
- **NOTES:**
 - FREE street parking is available throughout the Old Louisville neighborhood surrounding the museum.
 - The Conrad-Caldwell House Museum is a three-story historic home, but it is fully accessible via an entrance ramp and indoor elevator.

Corydon Capitol State Historic Site - Tour of the Old Capitol Building and Governor's Mansion

- **WHAT:** Step back in time with us to learn about the founding of Indiana and the early days of its government! We will visit the original Capitol building and Governor's Mansion during this walk-thru history!
- **WHEN:** (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every Wednesday and Sunday (10 am – 5 pm)
 - Tours are at 10 am, 12 pm, 2 pm, & 4 pm
- **WHERE:** 202 East Walnut Street, Corydon IN 47112
- **NOTE:** Tour space is limited to 10 guests per tour slot due to room size. We recommend calling before your desired visit to ensure availability. Some areas may be accessed only through stairs.

Culbertson Mansion State Historic Site – Guided Tour

- **WHAT:** The guided tour of the Culbertson Mansion will take visitors through the 20,000 square foot Victorian Mansion to see the artistry and craftsmanship in the home built for New Albany's best-known philanthropist of the Gilded Age.
- **WHEN:** (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every Friday (10 am – 5 pm)

- WHERE: 914 East Main Street, New Albany IN 47150
- NOTE: The tour requires steps throughout the house, and only street parking is available.

The Falls of the Ohio State Park - On Your Own Interpretive Center Exhibit Tour AND On Your Own Fossil Challenge

- WHAT:
 - Interpretive Center Exhibit Tour: In an hour or less, take a journey through time. From the depths of the Devonian Sea, to the Ice Age, connections to American History, and an introductory film.
 - Fossil Challenge: The park challenge is a fossil scavenger hunt; can you find them all? The Challenge is available anytime someone wishes to test their eyes and skills. Participation and completion can earn a park-related prize!
- WHEN: (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every day (9 am – 5 pm)
- WHERE: 201 West Riverside Drive, Clarksville IN 47129
- NOTE: Get your materials when you check in at the front desk.

The Falls of the Ohio State Park – Daily Fossil Bed Hikes

- WHAT: Discover the wonders of the fossil beds with a state park naturalist. We will look at Devonian marine fossils and discuss how they lived, what they ate, how/why they were preserved.
- WHEN: (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every day (1 – 2 pm)
- WHERE: 201 West Riverside Drive, Clarksville IN 47129
- NOTE: Hike lasts 60 minutes. Be sure to check-in at Falls of the Ohio State Park's Interpretive Center front desk and then meet on the Observation Deck at 1 pm. Wear appropriate footwear for uneven terrain and bring plenty of fluids for hydration.

Frazier History Museum

- WHAT: Come visit the Frazier Kentucky History Museum! With three floors of exhibit space, there is plenty to see and do.
- WHEN: (Recurring) May 30 – August 9
 - Every Sunday (11 am - 4 pm) and Monday (10 am – 5 pm)
- WHERE: 829 West Main Street, Louisville KY 40202

- NOTE: We have a paid parking lot behind our building. You can also drop guests off at the front and move your car if need be. To protect our artifacts, we keep the museum cool, so we recommend a light jacket.

Geeva Arts Festival: Indian Dance & Music Festival

- WHAT: Come enjoy an incredible afternoon of Indian dance and music, where artists will be exploring the theme "Migrations."
- WHEN: July 11 & 12 (3 – 5 pm) - *formerly 4 – 6 pm*

Jasteka Cultural Center: Masud Olufani in Conversation with Chef Kevin Nelson

- WHAT: An evening of conversation exploring the artistic practice of Masud Olufani in celebration of the installation of his sculpture Okra Fly. Olufani's multidisciplinary practice is rooted in the traditions of African foods and the role of African American cuisine in the continuation of that history, ancestor veneration, resilience, and cultural cohesion. Food is a vessel of histories embedded within the seeds of okra and the meaty flesh of the yam, writes Olufani. He will share a view into those histories and his artistic practice through conversation with Chef Kevin Nelson.

Jasteka Cultural Center

Looking for the Lilith Theatre Company – The Ancestors Project Community Workshop

- **WHAT:** Use the past to create in the present in this evolving community arts project based on the stories of ancestors who have inspired and guided us.
 - Each participant is asked to bring with them a story and a photograph* of an ancestor that is important to them. LFL facilitators will lead participants in theatre, visual art, and writing activities to bring their ancestors' stories to life. No prior arts experience is needed for participation.
 - *If no photograph is available, participants can bring a memento or other meaningful object that connects them to that ancestor.
 - LFL defines ""ancestor"" as anyone who has come before you who has informed in some way the person that you are.

Portland Museum – Learn Your City's History and Creativity

- **WHAT:** Come visit the little museum that could in Louisville's historic neighborhood of Portland! Founded 1978 within the walls of the old Roosevelt Elementary School,

Portland Museum's exhibits have since outgrown the classroom and are ready to be explored by you and your family. Discover the riverside community of Portland through our self-guided and profusely annotated historical wing. Venture from our city's origins on the mighty Falls of the Ohio onto the washed-away docks of the Portland Wharf. Stand proudly beside Kentucky's Giant Big Jim Porter and give our own Lady Steamboatman Mary Miller a salute! Measure the changes brought by the Great Flood of 1937 and hear the inspiring stories of the Portland Memorial Baptist Church. Hop aboard a handmade shanty or investigate a shipwrecked shrimp boat in our acre (or should we say anchor?) backyard! Have a question? Our expert docent is all-ears at all-times! After journeying through history, step into our Italianate mansion Beech Grove to become immersed in the artworks of our rotating gallery. Exhibiting creativity far and wide from studios and archives alike, make sure to check back in quarterly for new and exciting displays.

Riverside, the Farnsley-Moremen Landing – Tour

- WHAT: Explore the history of this Ohio River farm site by touring the Farnsley-Moremen House (built 1837). Throughout much of written history, a riverboat landing on the economic and cultural superhighway called the Ohio River connected this farm to the wider world. Discover the fascinating stories of the people who lived here over time!
